Explore Subotica and Palić

Subotica (Hungarian name Szabadka) is really worth to see. The northernmost city of Serbia, is known since 1391 by the name of Zabadka, but scientists believe the settlement in the same spot date some 3000 years ago!

A lot of history happened here; Subotica was a part of Serbia at 1527 (as a matter of fact, it was a capital of short-lasting country when signed self-proclaimed "king" Jovan Nenad "The Black" - apparently, the "king" has peculiar dark mark on the skin from head to toe, hence the name). Soon, at 1542 Subotica became a part of the Turkish empire, till 1686 when it becomes the part of the Austria-Hungarian Empire, and changed the name to Sancta Maria first, then to Maria Theresiopolis (by empress Maria Theresia). Subotica changed its name often enough - almost 200 times since 1391, till 1918, when it becomes part of former Yugoslavia.

Subotica is typical multicultural town with Hungarians (majority), Serbian, Croatian and many ethnic groups - Bosnjerci, with the total of more than 100.000 residents.

If you visit Subotica, don't miss the magnificent buildings of the old theatre and the City Hall (on the same square) or just walk down the Promenade with beautiful old houses all around.

Palić - The Park of Nature

The Park of Nature Palić stretches across 713 hectares, around the lake, surrounded by the big, beautiful park.

The lake was salty in 18 century, as the rest of Pannonic sea, as believed. The road from the lake has medical benefits, so in 19 century is built the Spa on the shore - and part of it is still there, including the Men's Strand on the beach, next to the lake. After the industry contamination, the lake was dried out in 1970, cleaned and tanked up again. The green color of the water is due to algae. Lake is, also, shallow - no more than 2 meters. In the Palić park, near the club is Palić Zoo, don't miss it!
